# **Course Description – FST 3021**

This course focuses on domestic terrorism and homeland security preparation. The course includes a review of the terrorists arrested and prosecuted in the United States, current events concerning homeland security, recent court decisions, Federal, State, and local agencies that may respond to a terrorist event, and steps to improve emergency operation planning in your community.

# **Student Learning Outcomes:**

Upon completion of this course, students will be able to:

- 1. Describe terrorist arrests and prosecutions in the United States, and lessons learned in homeland security in their local community.
- 2. Identify the legal and political issues concerning the prevention of terrorist activities in the United States, and in your local community.
- 3. Review and discuss homeland security, including emergency operation plans in place in your community.
- 4. Describe Federal, state and local emergency response agencies that may respond to a terrorist event.
- 5. Discuss specific recommendation to improve preparation for a terrorist event and improve homeland security.

# Term Paper / Subject Matter Expert Interview (40 points) \*

Record a video interview (10-15 minutes) with a Subject Matter Expert (see list of SMEs at end of the SCHEDULE below), from your Agency, or a Governmental Official from your community that has some responsibilities related to security, emergency response or planning, that is relevant to the topic of your Term Paper.

• The name and contact information for the SME you wish to use for your interview <u>must</u> be presented to the professors **at least three (3) weeks prior** to the due date of the final assignment so they can be vetted and approved.

Term Paper format: 10-15 pages; follow current APA format for the appropriate formatting for your paper. Link to Purdue Online Writing Lab (OWL). This online tool can help you find the proper way to cite the sources you use in the research for your term paper, as well as how to reference them properly within your paper.

There will be no credit given if both items listed above are not submitted at the same time. The final assignment requires submission of a video interview AND the term paper.

# **Grading Rubric**

- Postings: For each written post, grades will be based on your RELEVANCY paragraph and content. Please be descriptive and build out your thoughts fully.
- Videos: For each video, grades will be based on your discussion of the RELEVANCY to your agency or community. Again, be descriptive and build out your thoughts fully.
- Term Paper / Video: Grades will be based on following the APA format for your paper found on the Purdue OWL, and the RELEVANCY to your agency or community.
